Help your patients avoid a lapse in their Medicaid coverage

Your Texas Medicaid patients may need to renew their coverage. If not, they could lose their eligibility.

Please remind your patients to act quickly if they receive a Medicaid renewal notice. Renewing ensures patients can continue to receive services through your office.

Recertification/renewal is easy

The state of Texas offers several ways for your patients to renew, or recertify, their Medicaid coverage. Members should follow the instructions on the letter they receive from the state and submit their application using one of the methods listed on this flyer.

To check whether a patient is eligible for Medicaid, or if they don't know their renewal date, go to [YourTexasBenefits.com](https://www.YourTexasBenefits.com). You can also call 1-877-541-7905.

How to download a complete list of member Medicaid recertification dates:

1. Sign in at UHCprovider.com, using the button in the upper right corner
2. Open the CommunityCare tool by clicking the tile
3. Click on My Members to access a list of your panel
4. Click the "X" icon to export your panel to Excel and check the box for Medicaid Recertification date in the dropdown menu.
